Condom Use Toolkit

Male and female condoms are the only family planning method that provides protection against pregnancy **and** against sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including HIV. The Condom Use Toolkit (www.k4health.org/toolkits/condoms) reflects international consensus that programs should integrate programming and provision of condoms for both of these uses.

The toolkit provides a one-stop source for reliable, relevant, and usable information and links to guidelines and tools to help health policy makers, program managers, service providers, and others plan, manage, evaluate, and support services that encourage condom use. There is information about effectiveness, acceptability, best practices, training, service delivery, program management, and communication. Some of the resources are available in French and Spanish.

Condom Use Toolkit Partners

The Condom Use Toolkit was developed under the leadership of FHI. U.S. Agency for International Development, USAID | DELIVER, and Population Services International also contributed their knowledge and expertise. The partners invite users to provide feedback about the toolkit, suggest additional resources to fill information gaps, and share with other users how they have used or plan to use the toolkit. A built-in, moderated discussion board is provided for this purpose.



K4Health eToolkits (continued)

Partners with expertise and experience in the topic develop the toolkits collaboratively using a series of online features, including audio- and video-conferencing tools, text chatting, and a commenting feature that allows invited collaborators to provide comments about individual resources and toolkit sections. This participatory approach guarantees that the toolkits are of the highest quality. The continuous publishing principle on which toolkits are based allows them to evolve after publication to capture additional resources and to identify and fill remaining information gaps.
